### **CLERK'S REPORT JUNE 2024**

**Downton Road** – I have asked Gloucestershire Highways to ensure that the encroaching vegetation on the path running up Downton Road is cut back as priority.

**Footpaths exited onto Dozule Close** – Gloucestershire Public Rights of Way Officer, are kindly paying for the paths to be extended (up to the Kissing Gate) using type 1 stone and Leonard Stanley Parish Council have agreed to pay an additional cost so that they paths are topped with crushed stone. The work should be carried out the first week of June. The hoop of the kissing gate is to be removed and overgrown vegetation cut back.

**Youth Football** – held a successful end of year event, and after consultation with the Chairman, it was agreed to permit them to park on the Bath Road end of the Playing Field, strict conditions were imposed.

**Bin outside St Swithuns Church bus stop** – I have formally asked for this to be removed or relocated to next to the dog waste bin in Gypsy Lane. I am awaiting a response.

**Beards Mill** – I have asked the PCSO and Neighbourhood Warden to carry out patrols in the area, especially on nice days; as the good weather brings out groups who leave their litter, and there is evidence of drug use.

**Biodiversity Group** – have had an initial meeting. The group were invited along to Kings Stanley Annual Parish Meeting, where group member Nicola was giving a joint presentation with Stroud District Councils Biodiversity Officer Rebecca Charley. The Group is requesting a habitat and species record from the Gloucestershire Centre for Environment. A further meeting is being arranged for this month.

King's Stanley & Leonard Stanley Parish Council's, in a parish partnership, are pleased to announce the trial introduction of a new

online competition for budding young botanist, living within the above parishes. For reasons of safety and safeguarding entrants should be supervised whilst undertaking field studies, with a degree of assistance from parents.

Each month a photograph of a wild flower, i.e. grass, herb, shrub or tree, growing within the parish boundaries, will be posted in parish magazines, notice boards and on Parish Council websites. Other media may be considered and used at a later date.

On registration, name & contact details, entrants will be invited to identify the particular plant etc; by its common name, location, preferred habitat type, and whether or not it is good for pollinating insects. Answers may be submitted by hand at the Parish Hub, King's Stanley Village Hall, on Mondays between 09.30 – 11.00, or emailed to the <u>clerk@kingsstanleyparishcouncil.gov.uk</u>.

Two points will be awarded for each correct answer, with an additional two bonus points for entrants who answer all four questions correctly, making a possible maximum score of ten points per month. The answers for each round will be given and displayed the following month, as above.

A quarterly table of the top scores will be posted in all Parish Council noticeboards, Parish Magazines, and on Parish websites.

Monthly scores will be totalled after approximately ten months, with the winner and two runners up being declared in March 2025. The winner and two runners-up will be invited to attend a prize giving ceremony at the Parish Council AGM, T.B.A, to celebrate their participation and achievements in this competition.

Both Council's wish to invite and encourage all those eligible, to participate, to register their interest ASAP at <u>clerk@kingsstanleyparishcouncil.gov.uk</u>. so that we may commence this competition at the earliest opportunity, now forecast to be late May.

What better way to celebrate the arrival of Spring, out in the fresh air exploring our wonderful countryside, finding and seeing some of nature's spectacular biodiversity, and enjoying the fun of this competition.

Finally, parents please be aware, under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981, "it is unlawful to intentionally uproot, pick, or destroy the wild plant, or any seed or spore attached to the wild plant".
