
## **CLERK'S REPORT SEPTEMBER 2024**

**Vehicle Recording Camera** – I had a site meeting with the new Community Speed Watch Liaison Officer and the Community Highways Safety Officer. The location previously identified for the VRC was deemed unsuitable, due to device requiring solar panels and the proximity of the dwellings that would shadow the sensor.

A new site location was accessed near the boundary of the school playing field. This may be possible but I raised concern about the likelihood of development in the field adjacent to the school' which would then make this camera obsolete. No alternative location was deemed suitable.

**Build Back Better Funding** – I am delighted to announce the funding has been agreed, and my sincere thanks to County Cllr Wendy Thomas for supporting the grant application. The funding will be used to provide audio/video equipment, wifi and film licences, for the Village Hall. I am working with the Village Hall to ensure this project is successfully delivered and hope that events to tackle social isolation and cost of living can be held soon.







**Bench for War Memorial** – the DDay 80<sup>th</sup> Commemoration Bench has also been installed. **Replacing Stile –** I am meeting with the Cotswold Warden with regard to replacing the old squeeze stile, that adjoins Saxon Gate and Dyehouse Lane estates. The replacement will improve accessibility. It is hoped that a location can be found to retain the squeeze stile for 'show only'.

**Dog Waste Bin, Gipsy Lane.** Cllr Chris Connett reported the bin was in an unsafe condition, so I have ordered a new replacement bin. The old bin and installation of the new bin is kindly being carried out by Ubico.

**Remembrance Sunday** – I have applied for the road closure for Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November 2024. The Church Wardens will provide the risk assessment required.

<u>Wednesday, 4th September</u>, 2024 – Start: 10:00 am
<u>Coffee and a side trip.</u>
Difficulty: Moderate Duration: 3 hours Distance: 5.5 miles
Start point: Car park of Knead Eatery, Elkstone Studios, Elkstone, GL53 9PQ.
This is opposite "The Huntsman"Inn.
Optionally, turn up at 9:30 and have a coffee and fantastic cake before starting the walk at 10:00.
We will walk under the A417 and along to Syde, before a loop around and under the the road again at Granny's pumps. Then through Elkstone to the valley behind it.

## Tuesday, 10th September, 2024 – Start: 10:00 am

#### Not going to Grove after all!

### Difficulty: Moderate Duration: 3 hours Distance: 5 miles

Start point: From the A436 Andoversford to Bourton road, take the turn for Notgrove. Follow this road until you come to a building on the left called "The Lodge". Look for a sign for "The Gloucestershire way" and follow a minor road for about 200 metres for carparking at "Kiteshill Barn".

This is a scenic circular walk to the enchanting Cotswold village of Hazleton. There are no stiles and elevation changes are gradual in most places.

## Wednesday, 11th September, 2024 - Start: 9:30 am

### Selsey Common and Canal

Difficulty: **Moderate** Duration: **3.5 hours** Distance: **7 miles** Start point: **Stonehouse Town Car Park GL10 2NG** 

Once out of the town we climb to follow the Cotswold Way National Trail for much of the walk. From sheltered beech woodlands and over the rich open grassland of Selsey common, we guide you around remnants of an industrial past that shaped the landscape.

## Tuesday, 17th September, 2024 – Start: 9:30 am

## A walk in the Churn Valley.

## Difficulty: **MODERATE** Duration: **4 HOURS** Distance: **8 MILES** Start point: **NORTH CERNEY' GL7 7BZ**.

Walk starting points are near to the "The Bathhurst Arms" in North Cerney, A walk in the Churn Valley. A Summer re-run of the popular figure of 8 walk along the Churn Valley; centered on North Cerney we visit Rendcomb to the North on a 4 mile loop and then historic Bagendon to the south for a further 4 miles; giving walkers the option of going long or short.

Friday, 20th September, 2024 – Start: 10:00 am Shorter and Steadier No 8 Crickley Hill

Difficulty: Moderate Duration: 2 hours Distance: 3 miles

Start point: Crickley Hill Country Park Café GL4 8JY There is a £2.00 car parking charge.

Another of our quarterly walks around Crickley Hill Country Park, taking in the magnificent views and searching out the wildlife.
