**Planning Changes** - The government has announced plans to overhaul the planning system and increase housebuilding. Plans include introducing mandatory planning targets to deliver 1.5 million new homes over the next five years, updating the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) to bring back mandatory housing targets, ensuring every area has a local plan and building the next generation of new towns. Among the proposals in the <u>eight week consultation on the NPPF</u> are restoring mandatory housing targets and updating the method used to calculate them, not implementing the Infrastructure Levy as introduced in the Levelling-up and

Regeneration Act 2023, introducing the concept of grey belt into green belt considerations, changing affordable housing and mix policy, refocusing design policy on good design rather than 'beauty', and no changes to neighbourhood planning. We will be responding to the NPPF consultation as well as seeking engagement with the <a href="New Towns Taskforce">New Towns Taskforce</a>.

This spectacular walk leads you along peaceful woodland tracks and out onto windswept hillsides with breath-taking views.

Wednesday, 9th October, - ....... Leighterton, Westonbirt and Willesley

Start: 10:00 am Difficulty: MODERATE Duration: 3.5 HOURS Distance: 6.5

**MILES** 

**Start point:** St Andrew's Church, The Meads, Leighterton GL8 8UW. Please park considerately in the

village.

This is a circular route following public footpaths through glorious Westonbirt Arboretum to the pretty hamlets of Willesley & Westonbirt. N.B. There are several high stiles to climb over. Please bring a packed lunch.

Wednesday, 16th October, 2024 - Start: 10:00 am

Difficulty: Moderate Duration: 2.5 hours Distance: 4.5 miles

Start point: **Prinknash Abbey car park**, signposted off the A46 between Brockworth and Cranham

A walk over the hills around Prinknash Abbey with glorious views over the Severn Vale. It takes in Buckholt Wood and Pope's Wood as well as Painswick Beacon. There is a café serving lunches at Prinknash adjacent to the car park.

Wednesday, 23rd October, - ......... Coffee Morning Walk: 'Peaceful Isolation'

Start: 10:00 am Difficulty: MODERATE Duration: 3.5 HOURS Distance: 5.0 MILES

Start point: at Prima Arts Centre, Uley. This is at South Street, Uley GL1 5SS, but parking is restricted at the café. Therefore, please park considerately in the village.

Uley lies on the B4066, about 2 miles from Dursley'

Meet for coffee at 10 am. The walk starts at 10:30, ascending to the iron age hill fort of Uley Bury. We then visit

atmospheric Downham Hill and return to the start via Rockstowes and Shadwell. Meals are available after the walk at "the

Old Crown Inn' opposite the church and also at the Vestry café.

Thursday, 31st October, -.......... Poles Apart And Tetra Paks

Start: 10:00 am, Difficulty: strenuous Duration: 5.0 HOURS Distance: 11.0 MILES

**Start point:** Chavenage Green 0.5 miles north west of Chavenage House. Chavenage House is signposted from the A46, 2.5 miles south of Nailsworth.

From the Green we wander along a variety of tracks giving extensive views over the surrounding countryside. Most of the walk is on the level with only one short sharp descent. Refreshments and a packed lunch are required.
