#### **NEWS FROM ST. SWITHUN'S**

Hello everyone, in the Christian calendar October is part of the season that celebrates creation, and St Swithun's had a great time welcoming people in for Apple Day, Harvest Festival and the village school for their Harvest service.

We also had a busy time with the Autumn Big Quiz and as expected quizzers were engaged, baffled and inspired by questions from Quiz-master Dave Kerry,

the evening rollicked along. Many thanks to Dave, his scoring assistants and thanks to Godsell's Farm for donating cheese wedges that were a delicious part of half-time refreshments; in addition we thank KS Co-Op for their support. Lastly, thanks to everyone who helped set up/clear up and prepare the ploughman's platters and brought tickets. We raised £586.00 towards the replacement heating.

On the topic of food, the church has organised the return of the Wednesdays weekly Soup and Cake Light Lunches. Whilst we are trying to sort out the replacement boilers in church most of the sessions in November will be temporarily held in the Village Hall (6th, 13th and 20th November) gathering from 12.30 for a 1pm start. On 27th we will be back to the church and our normal time of 12.00 for 12.30 lunch. As before it's a 'Pay as you are able' event and we welcome everyone. Please contact either of us if you would like to join this sociable event.

In this month with its mix of wet, dry, gloomy overcast and strangely warm days it was good to see sunshine on Apple Day and plenty of people came along to watch and use the vintage Apple Press that David Newton set up in the churchyard. The process was intriguing and the scent of apples lingered for days. Inside church, cakes and drinks were served and the tower was open for visitors to go up the spiral stair and enjoy the views across the wide Severn valley. Members of the Bell ringing team supervised the tower climb and took visitors into the bell chamber and introduced them to the bells and ringing skills.

Very many thanks to David for all his work in bringing his Apple Press, single handedly picking a trailer load of apples from the community orchard for general use and helping people enjoy the age old process of juicing. Without his continued support giving his equipment, time and effort (and that press certainly takes some effort!) this event, which brings the community together, would not happen and in addition we would miss an opportunity to raise much needed funds for the church from our other activities on the day.

Which brings us to thanking the cake bakers, drinks servers and washers up, those manning the stalls and the bell ringers for their safe shepherding of groups up and down the tower. Thanks to the generous support of the community, we raised an amazing £500.00 towards the replacement heating.

Singing traditional harvest hymns at Harvest Festival still makes sense as we give thanks for the landscapes of fields and woods around us and for all that comes from work on farmland, allotments and gardens. The church was full for the school Harvest service, family members came to support the event and it was led by head teacher Mr Millner. Children, as always behaved beautifully and the song by year one about 'Cauliflowers Fluffy' was especially jolly. Harvest gifts at both services were brought for the Food Bank.

The church was very full at an earlier occasion when nearly 300 people gathered to say goodbye to a much-loved member of the village. Extra chairs were kindly lent from the village hall, extra parking was kindly offered at Church Farm, so many people wanting to show their appreciation and love for Audrey Webb came into church to remember her and give thanks.

Moving into November the church calendar reaches the Season of Remembrance. On Sunday 3rd there is an In Loving Memory Service at St George's, details elsewhere in the magazine.

The service in St Swithun's church for Remembrance Sunday starts at 9.45. At 10.50 the Act of Remembrance begins at the war memorial and will follow its pattern of familiar words, wreath laying, bugle notes and silence. There is a road closure around the memorial whilst this takes place.

## FROM ALL SAINTS SELSLEY

The main event for us at All Saints in November will be the traditional village Remembrance Sunday service on 10 November. As usual, we will gather at the village war memorial (as I suspect villagers have done every year since the 1920s) just before 11 am. Local retired Royal Air Force Principal Chaplain, the Rev John Shedden CBE, will take a short service at the memorial, 28 names of those Selsley young men who gave their lives in both World Wars will be read out, the Last Post and Reveille will be sounded, and

wreaths will be laid Including one from Kings Stanley Parish Council. Led by Selsley Scouts, we will then cross the road and process down to the church for an appropriate service.

During that service, the "Kohima Epitaph" will be declaimed by one of us thus reminding us of the WW II "Forgotten Army"in Burma and north east India. The epitaph is engraved on the War Cemetery in Kohima where 1420 Allied war dead names are listed. But the "Kohima Epitaph" didn't emerge from there. The words were written by John Maxwell Edmonds who was born in Stroud, where his father was a school master, in 1875. He graduated from Jesus College Cambridge and taught at Repton School, King's School Canterbury before returning to Cambridge to teach classics. He died in Cambridge in 1958 aged 83.

The epitaph, namely

When you go home, tell them of us and say, For your tomorrow, we gave our today,

It was regularly quoted when The Times notified deaths of those who fell during the First World War and was also often used during the Second World War. It now appears on many village and town war memorials.

John Edmonds apparently took his inspiration from an epigram of the Greek poet Simonides of Ceos to honour the Spartan soldiers who fell at the Battle of Thermopylae in 480 BC.

We will remember them.

#### FROM THE BAPTIST CHURCH

What are you looking for?

Last month we took some time out in the school room at Rudford church. We arrived to find a log fire blazing in the grate, and drinks awaiting us on a side table. It felt quite magical to draw aside, to rest and to be still. The welcome of the church warden and the comfort of the cosy venue soon put us all at our ease. We laid autumn leaves in the middle of the circle of chairs, and it was astonishing to find the rich array of meanings this simple display of nature's glory brought to us as a group.

We'd hired this venue for a day of quiet dreaming, reflection and prayer, and were intrigued by the old Bible story of Jacob and his dream of a ladder (or a staircase) connecting earth and heaven. Angels ascended and descended in his dream. We each considered, what was a ladder between earth and heaven for us?

Later we cogitated on a little verse in John's gospel which says that on Jesus, angels will ascend and descend, as if he were himself Jacob's ladder. Shortly before this, Jesus had asked the first disciples a simple but profound question: What are you looking for? That question connects us with our deepest desires, and makes us ask, deep down, what do we really want of God, of ourselves, of life? The question itself, held patiently in the heart, may itself become our ladder to heaven.

We approach Remembrance Day as I write. I think of the ordinary folk of Gaza, Lebanon, Israel, Ukraine, Russia, Sudan and elsewhere caught up in the lamentable cycle of atrocious violence that plagues the human condition. Our little quiet day was no summit of great world leaders negotiating for peace. But a taste of shared silence; of nature, peace, fellowship, warmth and welcome - might have helped those leaders to make a little progress. What are they looking for? If they seek peace only for their own nation, they will never find it. The route to heaven only comes in answering this question more deeply and more broadly.





#### GARDENING IN NOVEMBER

By the time you read this, the clocks will have gone back, and the leaves will really be coming down. There is a school of thought which speaks of "putting the garden to bed", and if, by that, they mean a good tidy-up, then I would agree, but to suggest that the potting-shed door should stay shut until March is to miss the possibility of sowing a row of broad beans, planting tulips and enjoying the short winter days, and bright frosty mornings as well as damp foggy evenings studying seed-catalogues by the fireside.

Broad beans are one of the earliest summer crops, and the earlier this month you plant, the better. If growing outdoors, plant the seeds a couple of inches deep, sowing a few spares at the end of the row to allow for failures. They don't need much fertiliser, but a boost when spring gets them moving will be appreciated. If your garden is exposed, provide support using strong sticks or canes and string. They shouldn't need extra water at this time of the year. If the weather looks like turning really nasty, I would give them a bit of protection, but a sheltered garden should suit them fine.

Collect fallen leaves, storing them in black plastic sacks, or in a proper cage of wire netting. They are more useful saved on their own than in mixed compost, as they rot down in a different way, making that nice crumbly, fine leafmould which we all covet as a mulch or mixed in as a potting compost. It actually takes about three years for a really good result, but it is usable after two years. Leaves of apple and other fruit trees are soft and rot down quite quickly, whereas oak, beech and sycamore take much longer. If your leafmould is taking for ever to rot down, the type of leaves could be the reason.

You can still plant autumn onion sets and garlic this month, provided the soil isn't very wet or frozen. Try growing garlic in a large pot or tub, if space in the garden is a problem, I find they do very well, and can be kept in the dry if there is a wet spell at a stage when the bulbs are ripening. You can take hardwood cuttings this month. Roses are nice to try, and any getting rather elderly are worth replacing. Take cuttings about the width of a pencil, around six or eight inches long, and cut them under a bud. Set the cuttings either in an earthenware flower pot, round the edge, or outdoors, somewhere you can keep an eye on them, at the edge of a bed by a path, for example. Make a little trench with sand at the bottom, and plant the

cuttings about two-thirds their length, and fill back with sandy compost. Leave them there undisturbed for a whole year, watering in dry weather. Next November, carefully lift them, and see if there are good roots, pot them up individually, and Bob's your uncle!

## FROM THE NEWSPAPER ARCHIVES

Sourced by Bill Henley

THE LIGHTING OF DUDBRIDGE. —The Chairman said that at the present time the lighting area did not include Dudbridge, and they had long felt it was desirable that Dudbridge should be lighted. He had been able to make arrangements with the ratepayers in that portion of the parish. The question was whether the Council would undertake to give the necessary instructions to pay in the first place. He had seen Sir William Marling. Mr Apperly, Messrs Humpidge and Holborow, Messrs Northcote and Cartwright, and Mrs Apperly, all of whom would be also willing to contribute towards the cost. He (the Chairman) would be responsible for the expenses. It would be for the general benefit of the parishioners. Mr Harper proposed that the permission be given and that the Clerk be instructed to have the lamps lighted.—Mr Pitt seconded and this was carried unanimously.

SUGGESTED ELECTRIC LIGHTING.—Mr Collins remarked that there was a parish in Yorkshire sufficiently go-ahead as to have electric light. Cainscross had sufficient power running to waste in the stream between King's Stanley and Cainscross to generate all the necessary force for lighting the parish by electricity at an expense which would certainly, managed reasonably, be extinguished in from ten to fifteen years. He thought the present price of gas, taken into consideration as against electric light (to say nothing of the quality of the luminant), made the subject well worth consideration. The electric light would, he believed, become the luminant of the future. The Chairman said he had looked into the matter, but he did not appreciate the suggested motive power. Mr Harper said he thought the outlay would be too great. Mr Collins said the Yorkshire people were able to start the whole thing for £750. Mr Harper said it was expensive to keep the thing going after its introduction. He alluded to certain lights erected by the Stonehouse Brick and Tile Company, and suggested that those would be the ones for the Council to adopt. The Chairman said he was inclined to suggest them for use at Dudbridge. Mr Collins said he was strongly of the opinion that the water and lighting should belong to the community, and not to any company or syndicate. The initial outlay would not be great. The Chairman said in a compact parish like Cainscross it was certainly an idea which might well be entertained and might be worked to the benefit of the community, but at present he did not see where the motive power was coming from. The subject dropped.

Stroud News and Gloucestershire Advertiser - Friday 28 January 1898

KING STANLEY. Charles Dangerfield, a labourer. of King Stanley was engaged at Red Hill Farm, Selsley for Mr Steele, farmer, one day this week, when he fell from a wagon and fractured his collar bone. He was taken to the Stroud Hospital, where the injury received attention.

On Monday last an accident occurred to Mr Hubert Pitt, a carpenter, residing at King Stanley, who is employed by Mr B. Pitt, builder, of Ebley. It appears that when coming. down a ladder he missed his footing and fell, severely injuring his knee. He was taken home by his employer. Dr. Prout was quickly in attendance, and the patient is progressing satisfactorily. Stroud News and Gloucestershire Advertiser - Friday 10 March 1905

KING STANLEY. A meeting of the commoners of King Stanley was held last night in the National Schools, The Rector (the Rey. A. C. Jennings) occupied the chair, and Sir Wlm. Marling and the following commoners were present: Messrs J. C. C. Kimmins, A. K. Morse, R. Gleede and W. S. J. Hallett (one of the trustees of the Baptist Chapel). Mr Kimmins proposed the following resolution: "That this meeting of the commoners of King Stanley hereby concur in the proposal of the Stroud Rural District Council, dated 11th April, 1905, to arrange for the addition of not less than 1,000 square yards to the King Stanley free meadows (over which, by ancient custom, the commoners have certain grazing rights) in satisfaction for compensation due to them, in respect of the construction of the Rural District Council's sewer." Mr Gleede seconded; and the pro- Position was carried unanimously. The effect of the resolution is that Sir Win. Marling will receive the compensation for the construction of the sewer, estimated by Messrs Bruton, Knowles and Co. at £90, and instead of dividing it between the commoners will throw an extra 1,000 square yards into the free meadows. The Chairman proposed a vote of thanks to Sir Wm, Marling for his liberal offer; and this was seconded by Mr Gleede and carried unanimously. A vote of thanks was also accorded to the Chairman for presiding.


