**Candlelight** – carol service with alternative readings/poems and items from the Cluster Choir. Refreshments afterwards.



#### **RECYCLING AT CHRISTMAS**

**Wrapping Paper** - Stroud District Council recycling teams are unable to take bin bags/carrier bags filled with wrapping paper. Please ensure recyclable wrapping paper is contained within your recycling box. Remove any tape, bows and ribbons from wrapping paper.

Synthetic, foil or glittery paper cannot be recycled and should not be placed in your recycling box
Any non-recyclable wrapping paper should be put in the grey general rubbish bin/beige sacks.

**Christmas Cards** - Please do not put **cards** in your **recycling** container if they contain any glitter, foil, plastics or embossing as they are not recyclable.
